FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parents and Guardians

In a recent article published in the Daily Maverick, education researchers state that due to the impact of Covid-19, learners have lost 18 months that may never be recovered. They also warn that these learners could be disadvantaged into adulthood.

Schools have done their best to help learners make up for the learning losses by offering extra support and the Department of Basic Education has introduced Revised Annual Teaching Plans that trim the curriculum so that focus is shifted to the essentials in each subject. Despite this, research shows that learners have experienced significant learning losses and that they lag behind their peers of yester-year.

As parents and teachers, this concerns us; especially considering that our children could be disadvantaged and that they may not reach the goals we envisage for them, in the timeframes we have set. So, what can we do to mitigate the impact of Covid-19 on the education system?

It has been found that parental involvement and learning at home are good predicators of scholastic success. Children, whose parents help them with homework and help them prepare for assessments or projects, develop the self-confidence and motivation that allow them to be successful at school.

In addition to these, helping your child with homework will highlight his/her areas of strength and weakness and allow for timeous remedial action and working together will grow the bonds between parent and child. The assistance of the parent will make learning more meaningful and motivate the child to greater aspirations.

Please take some time to read the article below. I am certain that the insights of the researchers who contributed to it will inspire you to knuckle down to working with your children so that as a team, teachers and parents can work to lessen the effect of the Covid 19-induced learning losses that threaten to impact our children.
